

# How to Sort and Dispose of Your Garbage

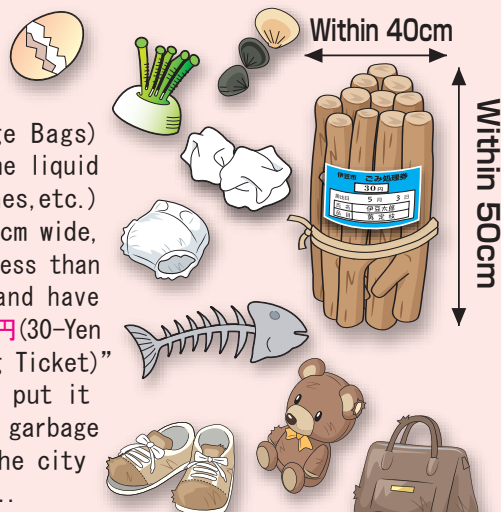
## Burnable Garbage (50cm or less)

Always write your name on the 指定袋 (Designated Garbage Bags) before taking them out for collection. Make sure to remove the liquid from your food waste before throwing it away. Wood (branches, etc.) from your household must be less than 50cm long and 10cm wide, put into bundles less than 40cm in diameter, and have the “ごみ処理券30円 (30-Yen Garbage Processing Ticket)” on them or please put it in the designated garbage bag provided by the city and dispose of it..

## Clothing/Rags

Designated Collection Sites

Though clothing/rags can be taken out as Burnable Garbage, we ask that you take them to the designated collection sites for recycling.



Tie them up with string or put them in a bag before depositing them at the collection sites.



Bring the garbage directly to the Recycling Center, City Hall branches or Ikiiki plaza to a collection site, within their collection hours. You will find these collection boxes at each collection site.

### Allowed

Clothing used in daily life, children's clothing, underwear, bedsheets, towels, duvet covers, leather clothing, neckties, etc.  
\*Clothing that is washable should be washed before being deposited.



### Not Allowed

Clothing/rags that are dirty, ripped, or wet, clothing/rags with unpleasant odors (oil, etc.), futons, blankets, pillows, floor cushions, rugs, door mats/bath mats, toilet covers, raincoats, pet clothing, shredded cloth, cotton blankets, curtains, etc.



## Plastic Containers/Packaging

Containers for cup noodle, etc.

Bottles, packets, etc. of detergent/shampoo

Labels and caps for plastic bottles

Bento packaging

Colored trays

Tubes

Cups

Rinse

Put directly inside netting without placing into bags.

Place inside netting

Look for this reference mark. Packaging, containers, etc. such as condiment packages that cannot be rinsed completely should be taken out with the burnable garbage.

## Plastic Items (50cm or less)

Strainer

Hanger

CDs

Hair brush

Zip ties

Writing utensils

Padding material

Clean as much as possible, then...

Place inside netting

Plastic items constitute anything made of plastic that is not a container or packaging. If there are metal parts, etc. in the item, make sure to disassemble it. If it cannot be disassembled, throw it out with Metals Other Than Cans.

## Styrofoam/White Trays

Styrofoam

Peel off any stickers/tape.

White trays

Colored trays should be thrown out with Plastic Containers/Packaging.

Dirty trays should be thrown out with the Burnable Garbage.

(1) Rinse

Place inside netting

## Oil Waste

Transfer used cooking oil (oil waste) into a screw-top plastic bottle with a capacity of 4 liters or less.



Deposit into a Designated Izu City Oil Waste Box.

Limited only to vegetable oil. (Unused oil and expired oil should also be transferred into plastic bottles.)

### × Not Allowed ×

- Oil that has been solidified
- Animal oils (oil with lard, butter, etc.)
- Mineral oils (engine oil, etc.)

## Cans/Tins

Rinse well, then throw out at the designated containers at the collection site. Aluminum foil that is not too dirty can be crushed into a ball and thrown out with the Cans/Tins.

Snack tins

Food cans

Metal caps for bottles, etc.

Place in container

For spray cans and portable gas canisters, use them up completely, then remove any caps, push button, etc. before throwing them out.

Do not puncture the can

Cap

Push button

Throw out with Plastic Containers/Packaging

## Metal Other Than Cans (50cm or less)

Rice cookers

Electric pots

Heated tobacco products

Power bank

Do not disassemble household electronics.

Clothes irons

Phones

Hairdryers

Metal hangers

18 liter drums

Pots

Clean as much as possible, then place in the designated container.

Exception

Bone-only umbrella OK over 50cm long.

## Batteries

Rechargeable battery/ Button cell

Digital camera rechargeable batteries

Place into 18 liter drum or container

Throw them out at the 18 liter drums or containers at the collection site. Household electronics stores, camera stores, etc. also collect batteries.

## Cardboard

(1) Remove any duct tape, staples, etc.

Duct tape

Staples

Sticker

How do I know it's cardboard?

You can tell it's cardboard if it has this kind of structure, regardless of its thickness.

Wave structure

(2) Tie with paper twine

Please try as much as possible not to throw cardboard out when it's raining, etc.

## Newspapers, Flyers, Magazines, etc.

(1) Sort by type

Newspapers/Flyers

Magazines

(2) Remove any extraneous things

(3) Tie with paper twine

Newspapers/Flyers

## Other Paper

Paper bags

Remove non-paper handles

Plastic wrap/foil dispensers

Remove blade portion

Tissues

Remove film around opening

Wrapping materials

Remove tape, stickers, etc.

Place in paper bag or tie with paper twine

\*Tie handles together with paper twine

## Drink Cartons

identification mark

紙パック

(1) Rinse

(2) Open up and dry

Place inside container

Cartons with aluminum coating on the inside must be thrown out with the Burnable Garbage.

## Bottles

(Clear, brown, and other colors)

(1) Remove caps, etc.

(2) Rinse

(3) Sort by color and place into containers

Clear

Brown

Other Colors

\*If you have difficulty categorizing a bottle, place it in Other Colors.

Make sure the inside is empty.

Place inside container

## Other than bottles (50cm or less)

(Glass, Ceramics, etc.)

Rice bowls/ Tea cups

Glass cups, etc.

Plates

Mirrors

Empty cosmetics bottles

Empty medicine bottles, etc.

(\*Use up completely before throwing out)

Clean as much as possible, then...

Place inside container

## Fluorescent Lamps/ Light Bulbs

Fluorescent lamps

Light bulbs

\*Including LED lights

Place into container

If broken, place into 18 liter drum

\*Including LED lights

Place into 18 liter drum

Make sure to place broken lamps, bulbs, etc. into an 18 liter drum or container so they do not break further, become scattered, etc.

## Plastic Bottles

PET Reference Mark

\*Including colored plastic bottles

(1) Remove caps, labels, stickers, etc.

Throw caps and labels out with Plastic Containers/Packaging.

(2) Wash the inside

Place inside netting

Do not crush bottles before throwing out.

Please try as much as possible not to throw these types of garbage out when it's raining, etc., since they cannot be recycled if they get wet.
